Evaluation Form for the Career Exploration Fair

The CEF survey will be online so that the students can access it immediately and provide feedback.

Do we need to make any changes to the language used in the survey?

There are some variables that may require teachers to go through this with the students. Some students will need the teacher to walk them through the survey which will take more time. We must remember we are raising the bar and trying to making sure the students are able to comprehend and complete the survey

Can this be done on an A day and a B day?

Can this be used as a daily grade?

Will everyone have to complete the survey?

We would have an expectation of a percentage. This will all be set up prior to the release of the survey.

It's really about the student's voice and choice which is tied to the freshman seminar class.
What number of students will be needed for the one on one sessions?
As many classes as we can see. Small groups are better for the sessions. Ideally a couple of hours with a freshman seminar class.
Will the vendor survey have something about time? Did they need more time or less time? We should not even open that up and maybe push back on that because the time was grossly impacted by the student busing issues.

In Nashville, the students had total choice and they were able remain in different colored zones without restriction. Can this happen in Jackson? We must remember Nashville has evolved to this over time. At some point we will look at this but at the current time our culture does not support this.

Academies of Jackson

We are moving forward all of the 9th grade students will be moving into career academies. We are currently working on grouping the students and giving the students choice cards. In January, we will work on teaching in teams and some people in Nashville will be coming in. We are talking out team teaching and working collaboratively. We are currently engaged with training with Apple and we talk about online surveys and we have purchased the LMS-learning management systems. Which will include Blackboard/Canvas where teachers can work with students at home. Our lead teachers have already been trained on this system.
